

Electrical work

Work and repairs on electrical installations may only be carried out by qualified electricians.

The following 5 safety rules must be observed:

- 1. Disconnection: Disconnection refers to the disconnection of all poles in an electrical system from live parts.
- 2. Secure against being switched on again.
- 3. Ensure no voltage is applied.
- 4. Earth and short-circuit.
- 5. Cover or fence off adjacent live parts.

Water & sewage



Connect the red hose (fresh water) to the "inlet".

Connect the red hose (waste water) to "waste water".



Danger of mix-ups!

Make sure that the hoses are connected correctly. In the event of a mix-up, there is a risk that the fresh water network will be contaminated.

Hitching a trailer with drawbar





When hitching trailers to tractor units, do not stand between them and do not hold the drawbar up by hand.

There is a danger that you will be crushed.










- 1. When hitching trailers, adjust the drawbar to the correct height beforehand.
- 2. Then step out of the area between the trailer and the tractor unit and guide the person driving.
- 3. Only step back to connect the electric and brake lines between the trailer and the tractor after hitching.



Securing a trailer

Reliable container securing

Securing containers with twistlocks on the loading area

- 1. Push up the tensioning nut (A) and turn it 90° so that the pivot pin you can see in the hole is at right angles to the direction of travel.
- 2. Tighten the clamping nut and
- 3. Insert the safety device (B) so that the clamping nut can no longer turn.

Ladders and steps, small

Caution! Danger of falling when climbing over the ladder.

Danger of falling!

Do not climb on railings or components not designed for this purpose if you have to carry out work at heights.



Do not climb the top rungs or steps of a ladder.



Do not climb onto trailers or loading areas without climbing aids and do not jump down.

Ladders and steps, small scaffolds









Do not step off stepladders onto other surfaces.

There is a hazard of the ladder tipping away.

Use single ladders for such purposes.





Use ladders of the appropriate size and secure them against falling over (if necessary).

Observe the instruction manual when using ladders. This includes, among other things:

- Do not use defective ladders
- Do not use the two upper rungs on stepladders.
- Do not use the three upper rungs on single ladders.
- Do not climb a ladder with two people
- · If necessary, secure ladders against slipping away.
- Only carry out light work from
- Do not lean out too far to the side.

Crane operation





You may **never** ride on the crane hook or on lifted loads. There is a danger of falling or being









Caution: danger!

- to the head if a load is swinging on the crane.
- to the hands if the load is set down faster than expected.


After checking the safety bars or other safety devices, leave the hazard area and give the agreed signal to the ride stand that the ride can begin.
